a) Does the faculty take initiative in curriculum development process?

YES, Three faculty members are board members of different Universities and participated in the development of curriculum in the concerned universities. In University of Calicut these teachers develop Department curriculum for the Teaching Department and along with other board members for the affiliated colleges.

b) Is curriculum suitable to make students globally competitive in the subject? If yes, substantiate.

The syllabus followed in the Department was revised recently and it is par with the UGC suggested syllabus. A few students who have applied for higher studies in foreign countries have been selected indicating that the study is approved for their higher studies in international universities. Of late, many students also get UGC NET or JRF in each year.

c) Does the department offer program with sufficient no. of electives options.

Yes. Each teacher offers at least one elective in each semester.

- d) While framing curriculum, is feed-back taken from stakeholder's viz. Students/Alumni/Parents/Employers considered?**

While designing new curriculum, comments from the alumni and experts who are working in the concerned area will be collected and analyzing the need of the era to curriculum is design. The present syllabus was designed by conducting a seminar on rethinking pedagogy and curriculum in psychology where in members from Higher education council of Kerala, and expertise from multidisciplinary areas contributed their suggestions.

- e) What is the frequency of curriculum revision? (3/4/5 years or more)**

Usually three years for core papers but electives are revised according to the recent developments

- f) Does the curriculum have emerging thrust areas, including interdisciplinary areas? (If yes, elaborate).**

Yes, but now keeping it as minimum as the time table of the campus community can not be adjusted accordingly. Critical psychology, Cultural psychology syllabus ensures development of analytical skills and introduction to Indian psyche with reference to art forms as well. Educational psychology, Forensic science, organizational behaviour, Management, Gender studies etc are integrated into Psychology.

Experiential learning is facilitated using MOOC and PERL model. Seminars and group discussions are designed in such a way that student engagement in teaching-learning process is ensured, apart from the presentation skills. Role-play, games (from theatre of oppressed framework), focus group discussion and experience sharing is incorporated to teaching-learning process. Field experiments is carried out by each student which opens up to immersive experience. Discussion with teachers of other departments usually contribute towards enhancing research culture. If necessary support from teachers from other Departments is also sought for interdisciplinary subjects.
