Avifaunal Species Diversity:

Birds have been described as feathered biped, warm-blooded vertebrate animals, whose temperature remains constant and independent of the surrounding temperature (Ali 2002). Avifaunal diversity is an excellent indicator of ecosystem stability because birds respond quickly to changes in their environment. Calicut university campus harbour rich biodiversity of birds. The canopy cover of the campus is much higher it provides shelter to the birds. The maximum species of birds was observed from Botanical Garden and the girls hostel area. A total of 65 species of birds was documented from the campus from Feb 20th 2022 to Feb 22nd 2022.

Butterfly Species Diversity:

Insects are one of the key indicators of healthy ecosystems, and they play a significant role in ecosystem functioning. Butterflies are the best-known pollinators and bio-indicators, belongs to the order Lepidoptera. Out of the 20,000 known species of the world India is home to 1500 species out of which 75 species have been recorded from the campus. The campus is like a green campus which provide host as well as nectar plant for the butterflies. The maximum butterfly species was observed from the Botanical Garden which harbour 40 species.

Herpetofauna Species Diversity:

Reptiles and Amphibians are among the most species-rich groups of terrestrial vertebrates, with hundreds of new species still being discovered every year. Herpetofauna species are essential components of terrestrial and aquatic ecosystems, being major secondary consumers and important prey for many tertiary and quaternary consumers. The campus harbour 21 species of Herpetofauna out of which 17 are reptiles, one Testudinae and 3 amphibians.

Mammals Species Diversity:

Mammals are an extraordinary group, showing an amazing diversity of species, forms, life histories and behaviors. The campus harbour 7 species of mammals. They

are very secretive and shy animals most of them are nocturnal in the campus hard to find. Some are identified with track and signs of it.

Odonates Species Diversity:

Dragonflies and damselflies are insects which are very ancient and belong to the order Odonata. They are predatory insects and active during daytime. The larvae are aquatic and adults are aerial. Odonates breed and are commonly found near water bodies. Their breeding includes both flowing and stagnant water bodies. The campus comprises of 15 species of Odonates.

Araneofauna of University of Calicut

The survey resulted a total of 67 species belong to 52 genera of 15 families. Salticidae was the dominant family with 19 species followed by Araneidae - 16 species, Lycosidae with 5 species. *Pardosa sumatrana* (Thorell, 1890) was the dominant species in the campus. The identified species can be classified into 6 different feeding guilds. Other hunters were the dominant guild including 6 families, followed by orb weavers, sensing web builders, ground hunters, ambush hunters and space web builders.
