2. Does the Curriculum provide opportunity for research activities?
3. Does the Curriculum ensure the learning out come?
4. Does the courses of the Curriculum tune with UGC-NET/CSIR examinations?
5. Do you think that the present curriculum helps overall development of students?
6. Whether the suggestion of the Teachers have taken into account during curriculum revision?

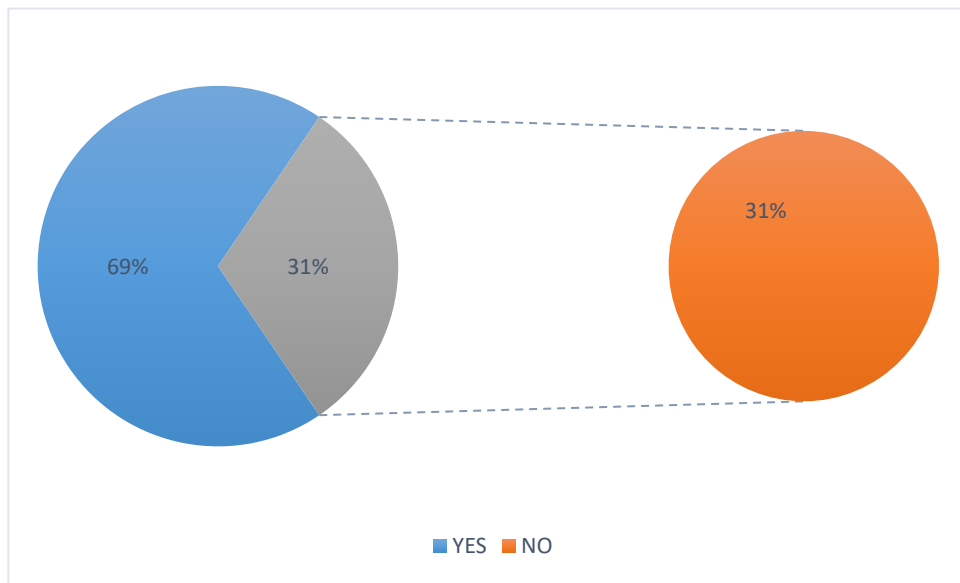
The respondents are the teaching faculties of university.

Total respondents: 132

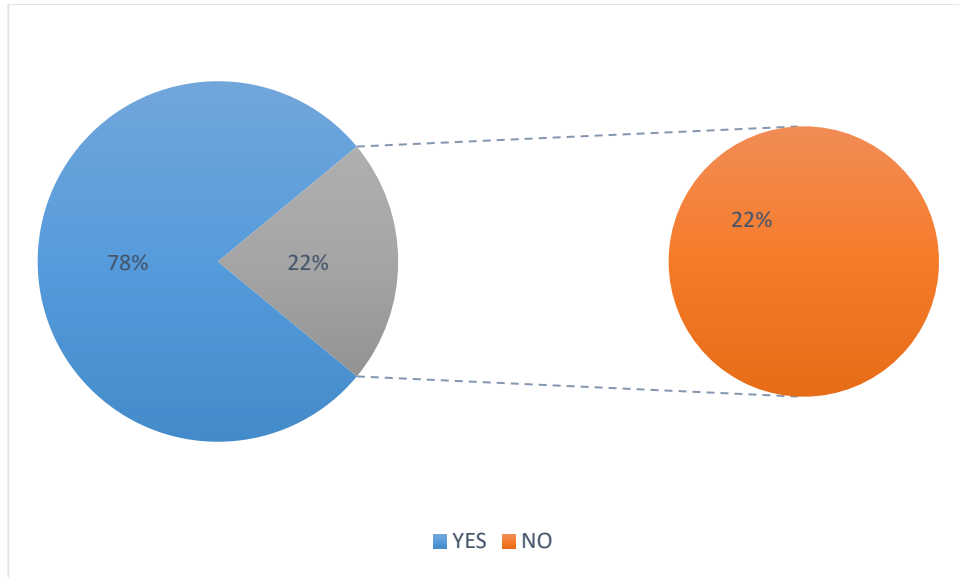
The percentage of respondents – 82.5 %

1. Does the P. G Curriculum meet the needs of students?



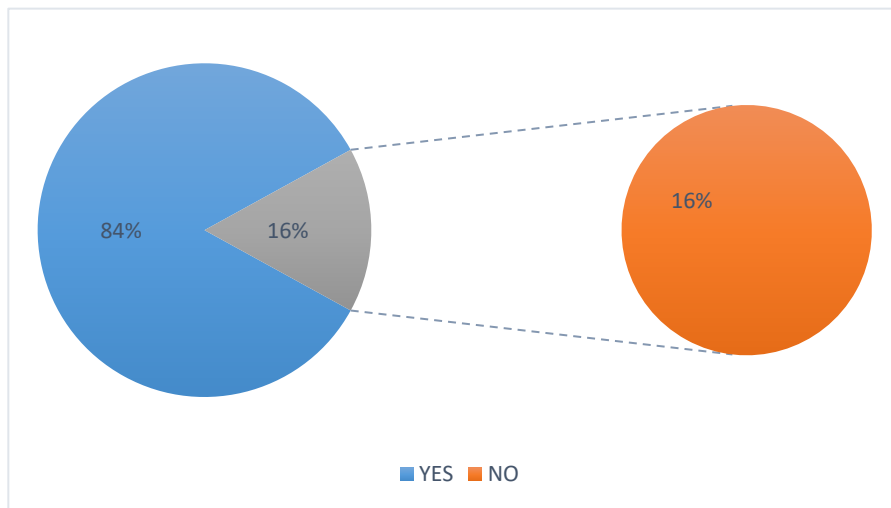
69 percent of the respondents agreed that the P. G Curriculum offered by the University meets the needs of the students whereas rest of the 31 percent of faculty members responded that it failed to meet the needs of the students.

2. Does the Curriculum provide opportunity for research activities?



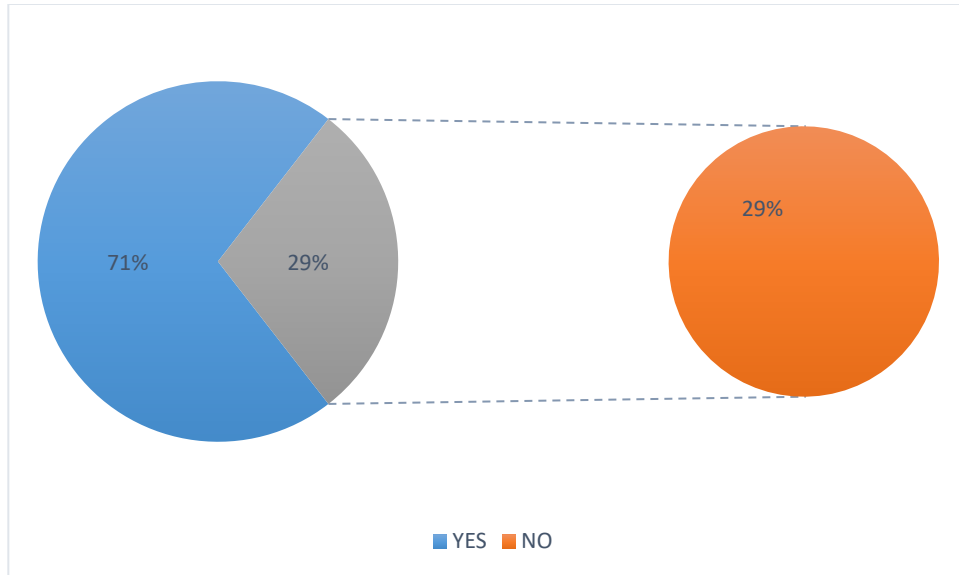
78 percent of the respondents expressed that the Curriculum provides enough space for research activities while remaining 22 percent of the respondents have showed their disagreement

3. Does the Curriculum ensure the learning out come?



84 percent of the respondents replied that the P. G Curriculum ensure its learning outcome, but remaining 16 percent of the faculty members remarked their disagreement to it.

4. Does the courses of the Curriculum tune with UGC-NET/CSIR examinations?

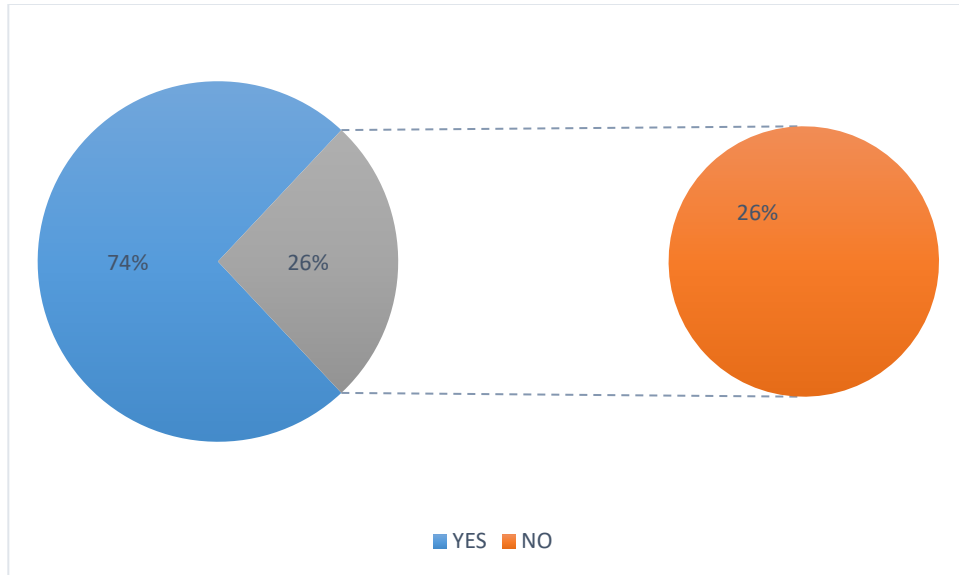


71 percent of the respondents have agreed that the courses of the P. G Curriculum are tuned with UGC-NET/CSIR examinations, however remaining 29 percent of the faculty members of the university expressed their dissent to it.

5. Do you think that the present curriculum helps overall development of students?

66 percent of the respondents think that the present curriculum helps the overall development of P. G students, but rest of the 34 percent of respondents think that the present curriculum of P. G Curriculum is not enough to help the overall development of students.

6. Whether the suggestion of the faculty members have taken into account during P. G Curriculum redesign/revision?



74% of the respondents opined that the suggestion of the faculty members has taken into account while redesigning or revising the curriculum, whereas remaining 26 percent of the faculty members have expressed their dissent to this opinion.

The consolidated feedbacks result on different aspects which pertaining different domains of university academics helped the university to understand, identify and address the weak points and to take actions to improve and fill the gap in various facets academics for the overall development of the institution
