5. Do you think that the present curriculum helps overall development of students?
6. Whether the suggestion of the faculty members have taken into account during program curriculum revision?

Details of the Respondents

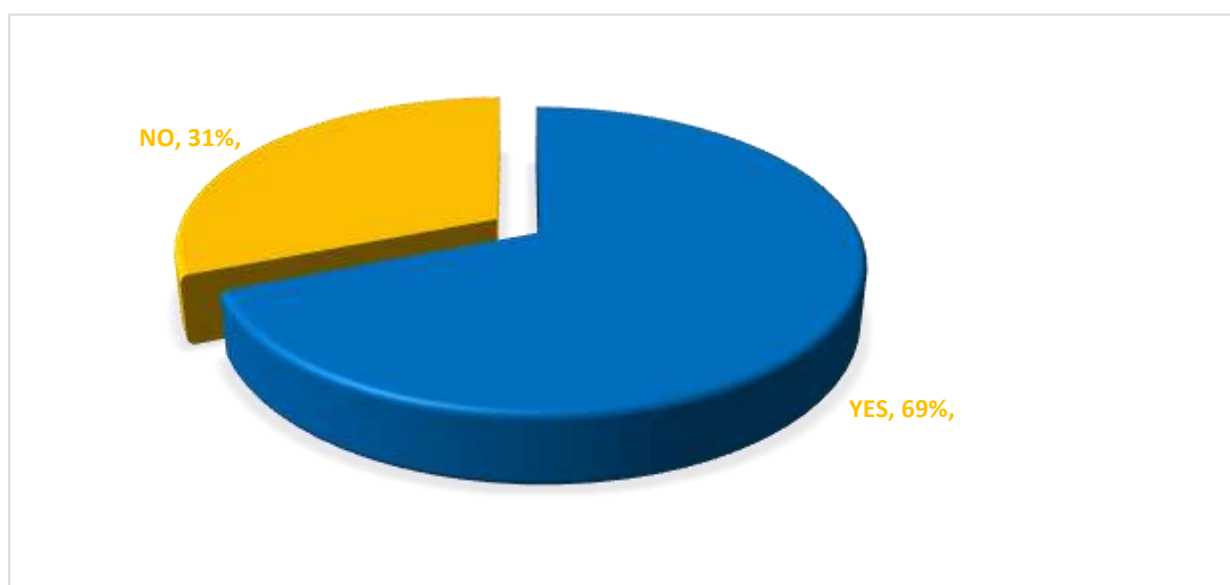
The respondents are the teaching faculties of university.

Total respondents: 117

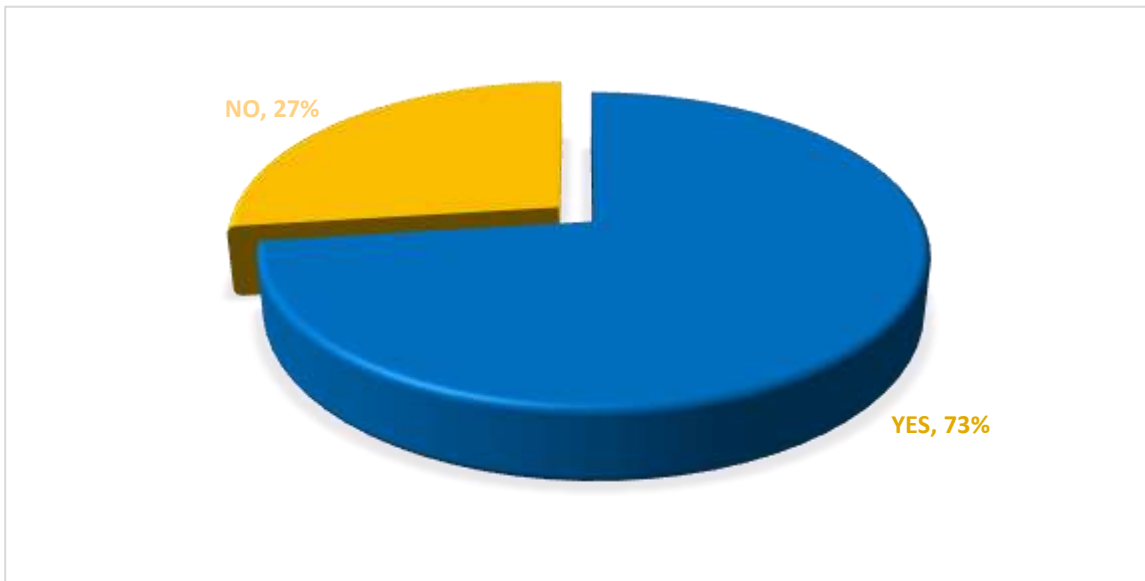
The percentage of respondents – 73.12 %

1. Does the P. G Programme meet the needs of students?



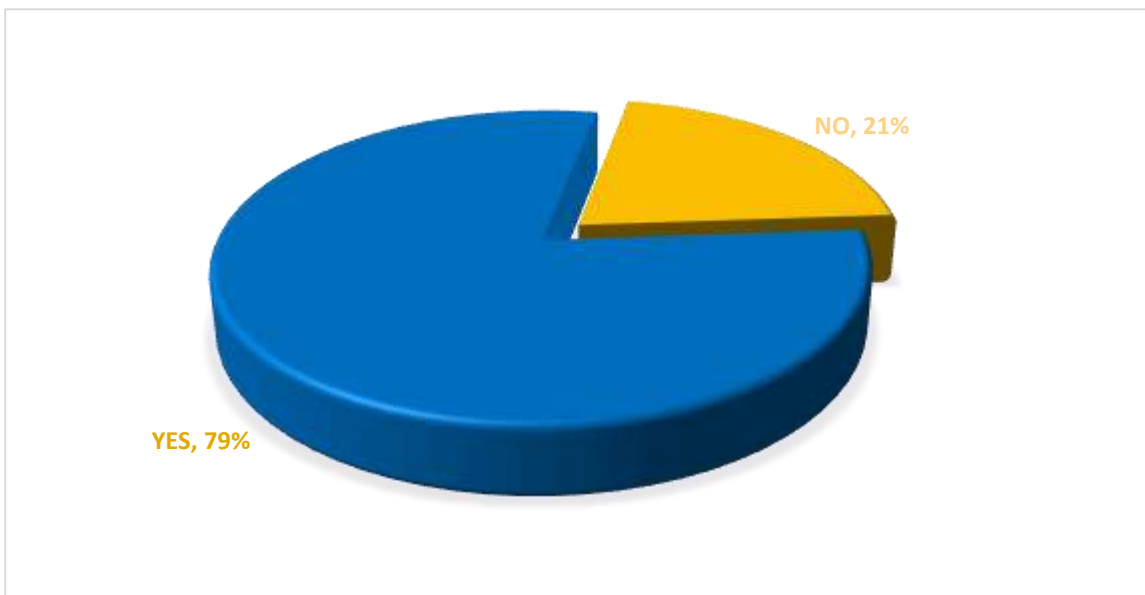
69 percent of the respondents agreed that the P. G programme offered by the University meets the needs of the students whereas rest of the 31 percent of faculty members responded that it failed to meet the needs of the students.

2. Does the program provide opportunity for research activities?



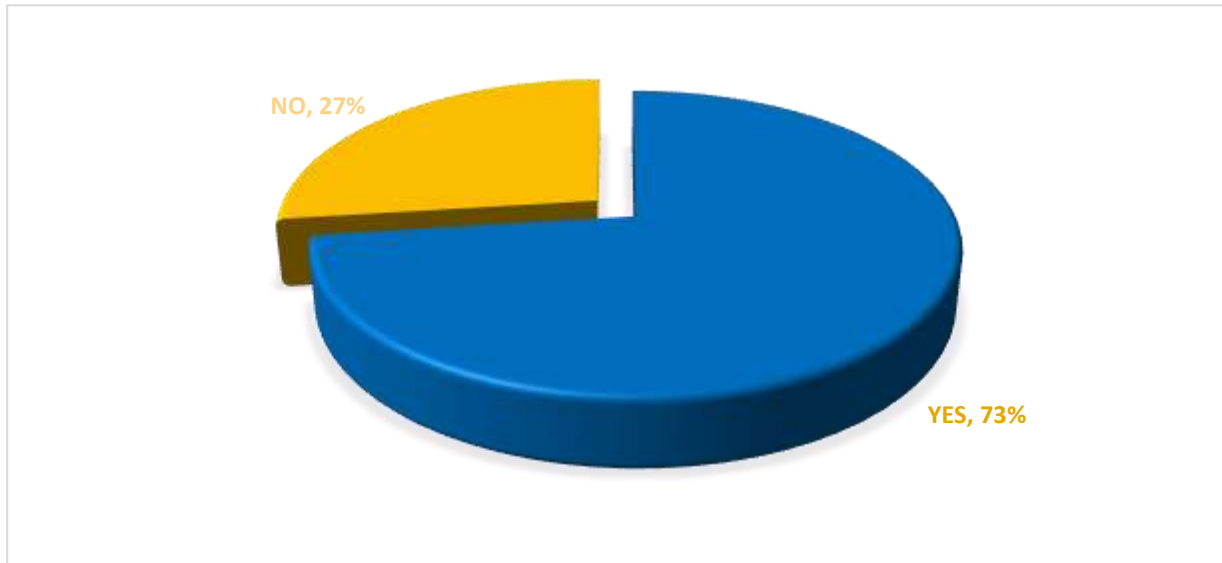
73 percent of the respondents expressed that the programme provides enough space for research activities while remaining 27 percent of the respondents have showed their disagreement

3. Does the program ensure the learning out come?



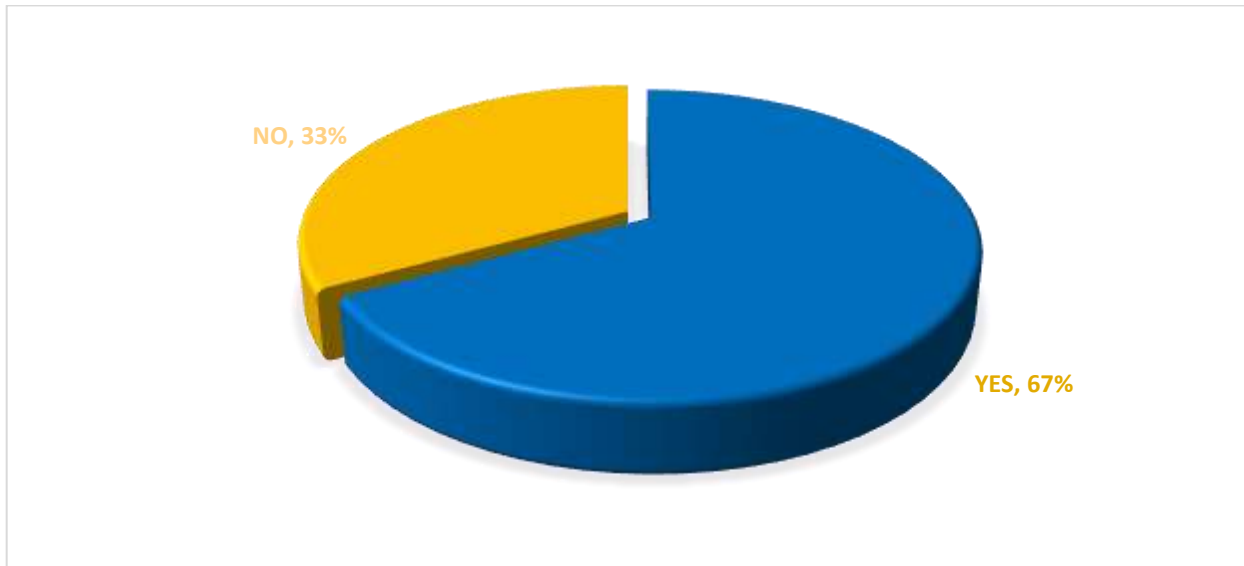
79 percent of the respondents replied that the P. G Programme ensure its learning outcome, but remaining 21 percent of the faculty members remarked their disagreement to it.

4. Does the courses of the Programme tune with UGC-NET/CSIR examinations?



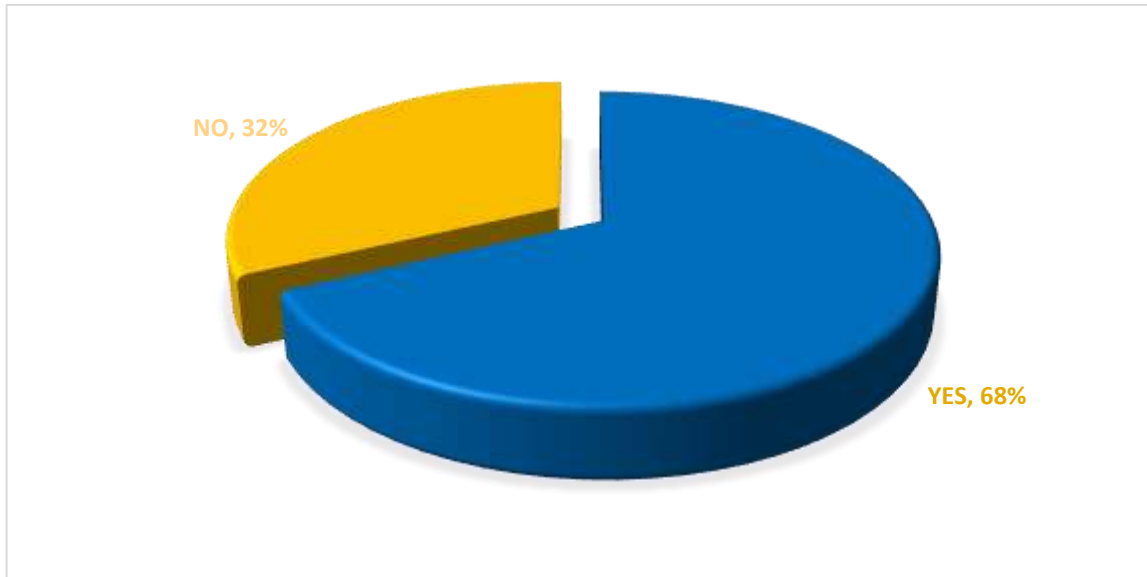
73 percent of the respondents have agreed that the courses of the P. G programmes are tuned with UGC-NET/CSIR examinations, however remaining 27 percent of the faculty members of the university expressed their dissent to it

5. Do you think that the present curriculum helps overall development of students?



67 percent of the respondents think that the present curriculum helps the overall development of P. G students, but rest of the 33 percent of respondents think that the present curriculum of P. G Programme is not enough to help the overall development of students.

6. Whether the suggestion of the faculty members have taken into account during P. G Programme curriculum redesign/revision?



68 percent of the respondents opined that the suggestion of the faculty members has taken into account while redesigning or revising the curriculum P.G Programme, whereas remaining 32 percent of the faculty members have expressed their dissent to this opinion.
